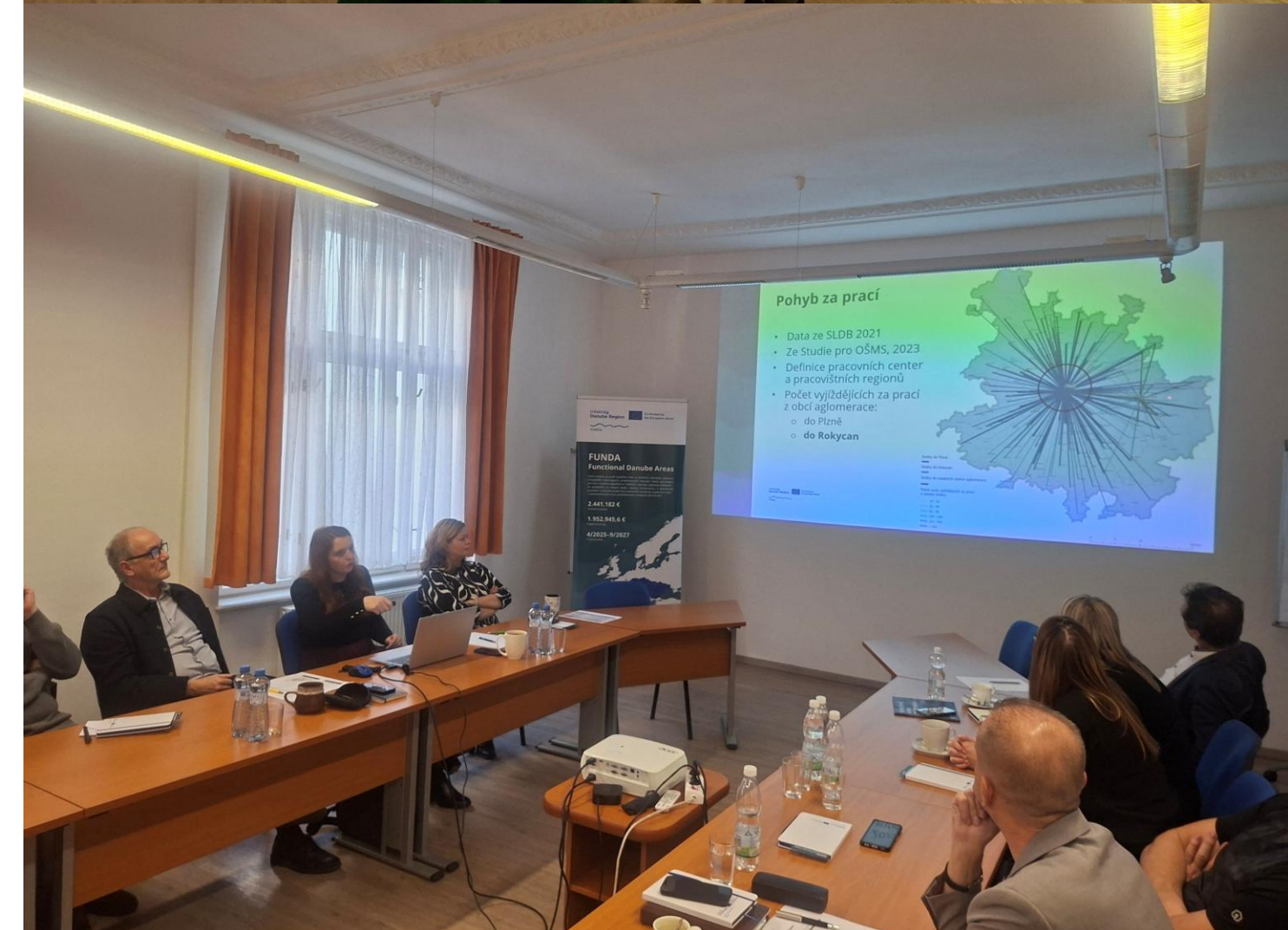
Basic workshop information

- Organiser: RDA PR

- Workshop title: 1st National workshop of FUNDA project

- Target group of participants: departments of public institutions, municipalities, NGOs



Purpose of the workshop

- Present the FUNDA project
 - Show the first analytical outputs for the Pilsen Agglomeration
 - Discuss the possibilities for involving regional actors
 - Set out further steps for cooperation.

- Main topic: development and management of public services in Pilsen Agglomeration (education, social services, and healthcare)



Methodological framework & workshop process

1. Introduction and context (FUNDA project, FUA definition, pilot activity)
2. Participant engagement and background knowledge (situation assessment)
3. Core activities:
 - a) Problem identification
 - b) Discussion with representatives of each pilot topic (education, social services, health care)
4. Consolidation and prioritisation of identified main problems
5. Conclusion, planning of the next workshop

Approaches used to engage participants:

- Combination of individual expert views and plenary discussion
- Individual perspectives of experts offered professional insight into the issue
- Plenary discussion ensured active participation and inclusion of diverse perspectives
- Final joint discussion helped synthesize key insights, build shared understanding, and align participants on common priorities and next steps

Key results and findings (1)

1) Education

- Capacity in preschool facilities and primary schools is generally sufficient, but its distribution does not correspond to demand
- Children's groups make up for the lack of capacity in kindergardens, but they do not provide education
- The accessibility of secondary schools by public transport, especially in more remote areas of the agglomeration, can be challenging

Key results and findings (2)

2) Health care

- The capacity of doctors providing basic healthcare is insufficient (the situation is most critical among pediatricians)
- The senior age of many doctors is also problematic

3) Social care services

- Social care services are currently undergoing reform, with mobile social care services and home health care being separated
- There is insufficient capacity in residential social services for both seniors and persons with disabilities
